Florida Renewable Energy Producers Association Announces Board Members

Tallahassee, August 17, 2007 --The Florida Renewable Energy Producers Association (FREPA) announce the arrival of three new members for its Board of Directors:

J. Allison Defoor, II

J. Allison Defoor, II is a third generation Floridian and is the state Coordinator for Earthbalance, a statewide environmental restoration firm. Often described as a "Renaissance" man, he is a well-known conservationist; businessman; Florida historian; former vice chair of the Republican Party of Florida; a seminary-trained lawyer; former county and circuit judge; Sheriff of Monroe County; Republican nominee for Lt. Governor in 1990 (as running-mate to Gov. Bob Martinez); and his service as Gov. Jeb Bush's "Everglades Czar." In the latter role he put together the largest land restoration project in world history. He was named one of the Ten Outstanding Young Men in America in 1985. DeFoor received his BA (Geography) and MA (Criminology) from the University of South Florida, a law degree from Stetson University, and a Master of Divinity from the South Florida Center for Theological Studies, where he is completing a doctorate in ministry. He served on the Board of Governors of the Florida Bar and is an "AV" rated lawyer.

David (Ted) Hill

Ted Hill is President of CQ Specialty Materials Group /Telogia Power, LLC. Mr. Hill is known as one of Florida's most experienced renewable energy developers.

He is responsible for all facets of project and business development in the energy sector for CQ Inc. with a primary focus on the renewable energy arena. Additional duties include the oversight, operation and fiduciary management of Telogia Power, LLC a 14 megawatt biomass -to-energy that was acquired from DG Energy Solutions, LLC, along with managing the day -to-day operation of CQ Specialty Materials Group, a multipurpose fuels acquisition and materials brokerin g organization responsible for the stewardship of about 300,000 tons of materials commodities annually.



As Senior Vice President of DG Energy Solutions, LLC, Ted Hill lead the Alternate Fuels Division. While serving as President & Chief Executive Officer, he had complete fiduciary, regulatory and operational responsibility for DG Telogia Power, LLC. He was educated at Bristol College of Technology in Bristol, England, where he earned a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering.

Jerome Foster

Mr. Foster has been involved in renewable energy development since the 1980s. He is the founder and managing member of Biorenewable Projects, LLC of San Diego, California, a renewable energy development company engaged in projects all over the country with a sterling reputation as a resource based company. A Florida native, Mr. Foster recently opened an office in Tallahassee. Coming from Caterpillar, Inc he was the Founder, Chairman and CFO of Pentech Energy Solutions, Inc., which he sold in 2001.

Biorenewable Projects creates renewable energy technology for electricity, using natural resources of the client's geographic location. These resources include solar, wind, and cow dung. A sample of one of their current projects is a \$36 million methane facility in California's Imperial Valley, which will generate 14 megawatts of electricity—enough to power 98,000 homes. The electricity will be sold to Imperial Irrigation District starting in 2008.
